Pottery

Adult pottery classes are open to beginners and intermediates. The curriculum includes hand-building, wheel throwing, glaze application and decorative techniques on high-fired stoneware. Because clay melts at different temperatures, only pots made in our studio with clay supplied by the Pottery may be fired in our kilns. Clay and tools cost extra. Glaze materials and firing are included in the cost of clay. All classes meet regardless of holidays, unless otherwise noted. 16 Students max.

Bench times are offered to students at no extra charge. Please read carefully to understand what days you will have access to the clay studio.

Bench times for all students: Tuesdays, Saturdays & Sundays 12:30 - 3:00 p.m.

- You are allowed to go to any 2 out of the 3 offered days. You must sign in to bench time.
- There will be unofficial bench times associated with PM1 & PW1. If you are in one of these classes, you may go to the bench time following your class plus one additional separate day.
- Saturdays and Sundays: Option to stay 1 additional hour with a \$5 cash donation to our Fundraising General Fund.



Jewelry

Metalsmithing courses are designed to accommodate the beginner as well as the advanced student and covers all the fundamental topics of jewelry making basic techniques, including sawing, filing, soldering, texturing and patina coloring. Individual attention will allow the student to progress at their own pace. Students with previous experience will have the opportunity to select a project. Materials are extra. 10 students max.

Weaving

Four and Eight Harness Weaving

The beginner is introduced to all steps of weaving including winding a warp, threading a loom, reading a draft, and weaving a variety of patterns. Finishing techniques will also be covered. The Intermediate student receives individualized instruction and is encouraged to explore the diversity of the craft. Materials are extra. 9 students max. All weaving classes are held on our second floor weaving studio which is only accessible by stairs.

YOUTH HANDBUILDING

Your child will love exploring the world of clay in our large, sunny, clay studio. Students will create functional and non-functional pottery using techniques such as: pinching, coiling, extruding, and slab construction. Surface design may include stamping, carving and rolling out patterns using material, lace and natural objects. Colored underglazes and a clear glaze will be used to finish each piece.



Students must be 8 - 11 years old to participate in this class.

CLAY ANIMALS IN THEIR HABITATS

A week of clay awaits! Learn a variety of hand-building techniques while molding animals in their habitats: An elephant in the wild jungle, a penguin from the chilly arctic, colorful underwater fish and more. Design and build a habitat for your animals using recycled tubes, cardboard, foam, paper, pipe cleaners, and colorful paints.

This is a wonderful introduction to clay and architecture. Hand building techniques will be taught to create animals and their habitats using air dry clay and recycled materials. Bring a smock and a snack.

Students must be 7 - 10 years old to participate in this class.

Experienced students will be challenged with learning to throw more complex forms and vessels. Decorating, altering, and finishing techniques including glazing will also be taught.

Teen students are allowed to attend the general pottery studio bench times held on Saturdays and Sundays 12:30 - 3:00 p.m. with the option to stay 1 additional hour with a \$5 cash donation to our Fundraising General Fund.

Materials extra. The materials needed are a tool kit and a bag of clay totaling \$50.

Students must be in grade 7 - 12 (12 - 17 years old) to participate in this class.
